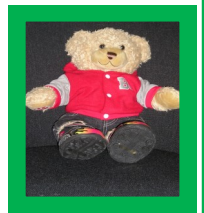


## Attendance Matters

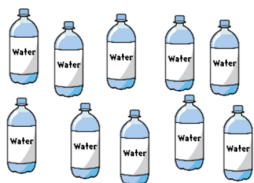
